# B. Review ISASP & FAST Data – Mrs. Kerian & Mrs. Fish ISASPs Trend Data

This data shows if our core curriculum meeting our students' needs

10th and 11th graders grew in both ELA and Math

10th grade grew in Science

9th grade did not grow in ELA and Math

8th grade grew in ELA, Math, and Science

7th grade did not grow in ELA and Math

6th grade grew in both ELA and Math

5th grade did not grow in ELA, Math, or Science

4th grade grew in both ELA and Math

3rd grade did not grow in ELA and Math

We looked at the yellow decreasing and the blue increasing in the graphs.

Doug shared that the elementary school chose to focus on implementing the Science of Reading to help students improve their ELA skills.

#### Conditions for Learning Data

A survey is administered in grades 3-12

Designed to measure safety, engagement and overall learning environment Scores are the % of students answered positively about:

Grades 3-5 Top score was student to student relationships

Low score was emotional safety

Grades 6-12 Top score was Physical Safety

Low score was Emotional Safety

#### FASTBridge data

A screener that the state of lowa uses to show growth in math and reading -3X a year A Math study was done 3 years ago - the elementary adopted the Zearn curriculum

Growth was shown in grades 2-4

K-1 data showed 80% of students proficient in Math

#### eReading Screener

It will take 2 to 3 years to show growth in this area

5th and 6th grade scores lower in reading so teachers are having deep

discussions to figure out how to improve instruction

#### Early Reading Composition

TK-1 are screened 3x a year and teachers look at this data to think of interventions to help students grow in their reading skills
